Don't litter

Country park visitors usually bring food and drinks with them for their trip. Some inconsiderate visitors may leave the packages of food and drinks along the walking path. This kind of behaviour is beyond tolerance. We should never litter and we should keep the environment sanitary so that every citizen can enjoy the beautiful natural scenery.

Don't feed wild animals

Don't feed any wild animals in the country parks. Visitors may sometimes come into contact with wild animals and find it interesting to feed them with food. However, this behaviour may lead to injury as wild animals are jeopardsous and hard to predict. Also, feeding wild animals is also an easy way to be infected with diseases.
